THE 2022-23 SCHOOL REPORT IS IN!

Even with the continued stress and uncertainty of gang activity, scarcity of food, fluctuating inflation, and increased prices for basic supplies like water and gas/diesel, and food staples like rice, beans, and spaghetti, our school maintained a 95% retention rate of our student body this school year.

Maintaining a high retention rate is critical to our students' academic success: without consistent schooling, children in Haiti struggle to pass the mandatory government exams contributing to the high drop rate of nearly 57% of all enrolled students by Grade 9.

Your gifts help ensure our students stay in school to at least the highest Grade we offer, Grade 9. By providing the tuition, books, uniforms, supplies, and a daily lunch, families are able to send their children to our school every year.

Our school families and students cannot thank you enough for all that you are doing for them, their children, and their community.

As HIMH's capacity grows, thanks to your generosity, we are able to ensure the school's administration practices and personnel have the resources and tools they need to provide the reporting, accountability and transparency for our school.

We look forward to sharing more details on the school and students with you in the coming months and years.

Your love, compassion, and prayers continue to be needed for our children and families. Haiti's circumstances have not changed significantly since gangs took over the seaport in Port au Prince, 1 year ago this September. Parents continue to struggle to feed their children and gang activity continues to rule the country.

In addition, the land dispute in Montrouis remains unresolved. Earlier this month, the community experienced a resurgence of violence from the gangs controlling the land in the mountains East of Montrouis.

As Paul reported, "Thank God we have a strong local Police that is able to protect our community".

Developing the next generation of leaders in Haiti through access to education

Build. Grow. Learn.

How is it that our "news from Haiti" often contains both heart wrenching updates and inspirational stories and hope? The human experience includes suffering, joy, and hope. Haiti's historical and present circumstances bring these stark realities into sharp focus, time and again.

When the situation in Haiti becomes particularly desperate for our children and families, as it is right now, we ask whether our priority should shift to providing basic necessities of life, or stay the course, providing access to education.

Every time we ask this of our Haitian staff and partners, the answer remains the same: stay the course.

Keep providing access to education.

An educated child is more likely to make good decisions, become a responsible citizen, enjoy improved health, and find employment. An educated girl is more likely to raise healthy and educated children, arresting the cycle of poverty.

Keep operating a school that provides the necessary books, uniforms, supplies, staff wages, and daily meal. The majority of schools in Haiti do not provide these resources, and families are unable to afford the \$500-\$600CAD school expenses each year, per child, to access education for their children, and often make difficult decisions to stretch their household resources.

Do what you can, when you can, to support the school families and their nutritional needs.

Our annual Meals For Minds December campaign this year will include raising funds for both the school feeding program and again providing family meal kits.

And there is always a gentle ask, yet not so subtle ask, about when the school could provide a Highschool education.

In Grades 1 through to 9, students work toward successfully writing their government Grade 9 exams which allows them to continue onto Highschool grades 10 through to 13. However, this occurs only if their families can afford to pay for their child's education expenses. Most cannot, contributing to the 57% drop out rate at Grade 9.

In the next 3 years, 40 more students at our school are anticipated to completed Grade 9. In 5 years, that number will be 86. In 10 years, it grows to 176.


Our vision remains to provide access to education and the opportunity for children in Haiti to pursue opportunities for higher learning.


It is time for us to build, our school to grow, and our students to access higher learning.

Our school has grown from 50 students to its current enrollment of 330 students! Prior to 2020, Louise (HIMH Chair) and Dianna (L4H Chair) would take a photo "inventory" of students during their annual visits to the school, and obtain a little information about each student. Since Covid, this work has been contracted to a local Haitian photographer, working with Paul and Sophania (IMR School Secretary). As the data volume grows, and Sophania's administrative capacity expands with her schooling, it is time for the data in Canada to be managed in a more efficient manner than multiple Excel spreadsheets, computer folders, and class lists.

Sonyia's project includes consolidating all student data into one Excel spreadsheet, tracking their historical enrollment and Grade advancement to current, and capturing personal bits of data we've collected. This work will allow easy migration into one of the data management systems she's researching to eventually "hold" all the student data and their individual photos.

When completed, we'll be able to easily track a student's progress over time, ensure records kept in Haiti and Canada are accurate and consistent, and create "student stories" to connect you more closely with the children you support!
